1600 hours today is the deadline for submission of proposals for a rescue-pumper for the Goodwins Mills Fire-Rescue.

All proposals will be opened publicly and proposals will be available for public inspection. Abstracts will not be prepared for distribution by the Goodwin's Mills Fire-Rescue, Lyman-Dayton Fire Commission, Town of Lyman or Town of Dayton.

The Lyman-Dayton Fire Commission reserves the right to waive all informalities in proposals, to reject any and all non-conforming or conditional proposals, and to accept any proposal, portion thereof, or reject any or all proposals, or portions thereof, should it be deemed in its best interest to do so.

This request for proposals does not, by itself, obligate or commit the Goodwin's Mills Fire-Rescue, Lyman-Dayton Fire Commission, Town of Dayton or Town of Lyman the authority to purchase. The intent of purchasing this apparatus is based upon the positive support of the voters at annual town meetings for the Towns of Dayton and Lyman, Maine. Town meetings will be completed June 14, 2014.

Following Town meetings, proposals will be reviewed and graded. The Fire Chief will make a recommendation to the Lyman Dayton Fire Commission on June 19, 2014. The Lyman-Dayton Fire Commission shall govern the award of this proposal.
